November 2022	VANISH: Art as therapy workshops This project involves delivering therapeutic art workshops to target the needs of individual affected by past and forced adoption; one for adoptees and one for mothers. These workshops are designed and delivered by VANISH (the Victorian Adoption Network for Information and Self Help).
November 2022	VANISH: Writing as therapy workshops This project involves delivering therapeutic writing workshops to target the needs of individual affected by past and forced adoption; one for adoptees and one for mothers. These workshops are designed and delivered by VANISH.
November 2022	VANISH: Common threads workshop This project involves delivering therapeutic textile workshops to encourage expression and creation, targeting the needs of adoptees. This workshop is designed and delivered by VANISH.

November 2020	ARMS: Digitisation of ARMS' history A project to secure the history of ARMS (Victoria) and ensure it is available into the future by digitising their extensive organisational history. Digitisation has also improved storage, protection, and access to the vast amount of documentation that ARMS holds.

November 2020	VANISH: Supporting fathers affected by past and forced adoption This project was expected to deliver two therapeutic writing workshops to target the needs of individuals affected by past and forced adoptions; one for adopted people and one for natural parents. Unfortunately, workshop delivery could not proceed due to the impacts of COVID-19 on many factors including attracting a sufficient number of participants. The remaining funding will be used to support projects approved during the November 2022 funding round.
November 2020	VANISH: Mental health and diversity training VANISH staff and volunteers received customised training on mental health first aid, self-care, and LGBTIQA+ (lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, intersex, queer, asexual and other sexually or gender diverse) awareness.
December2019	VANISH: Writing as therapy workshops Therapeutic writing workshops to target the needs of individuals affected by past and forced adoptions; one for adopted people and one for natural parents.
December2019	ARMS: 'Taken Not Given' memorial statue booklet Publication of a booklet including photos and speeches from the 2018 unveiling event of ARMS's statue, 'Taken Not Given'. This project aims to include and connect with the many ARMS members who were not able to attend the unveiling in person.
December2018	ARMS: Victorian Regional Outreach Support Groups The delivery of outreach support groups in Ballarat and Traralgon.
June 2018	ARMS: Mildura Outreach Advocacy – Mildura Outreach Support Project continuation A project to increase advocacy and support to women in the north-west of Victoria affected by past forced adoption policies and practices. ARMS facilitated 4 support groups and worked to increase local awareness.
February 2018	VANISH: Art therapy course The delivery of a course specifically designed to target the needs of adoptees.
November 2017	ARMS: Self-healing event A one-day event featuring speakers and a therapeutic activity, held for women who have lost children to adoption.
November 2017	ARMS: Information and support platform updates An IT consultant was employed to update the organisation's website, construct a social media presence and train members in maintaining these platforms.
August 2017	Adoption Origins Victoria Inc: Facilitated retreat A facilitated retreat to build individual and organisational capacity via the development of an organisational plan in a team strengthening environment.
June 2017	Adoptee Round Table Think Tank (ARTT) A 2-day gathering of adoptees to discuss their support needs for the future.

June 2017	Connections UnitingCare: Mental health first aid training The delivery of training to equip staff providing adoption programs with the skills to better meet the mental health needs of those affected by past forced adoption policies and procedures.
June 2017	VANISH Raising awareness of the effects of past forced adoption policies and practice in Mildura and Horsham regional areas, including facilitating regular support groups in Mildura.
June 2017	VANISH New and existing support group facilitators of metropolitan and regional support groups attended training to improve their skills in group work facilitation.
May 2017	VANISH Two events were held to commemorate the State and National Apologies for Forced Adoption, in October (2016) and March (2017) respectively.
May 2017	VANISH (lead agency) and ARMS Initiatives were undertaken to increase awareness of existing, jointly run regional support groups.
May 2017	ARMS A project to develop the skills of existing support group facilitators so that they are able to better assist attendees.
May 2017	ARMS Two ARMS publications were updated and reprinted; An information pamphlet and a booklet marking the 30th anniversary of ARMS with the aim of increasing community awareness of the loss and trauma of adoption.
March 2017	Independent Regional Mothers (IRM) (Auspiced by Wellington Shire): Cherished memorial A bronze statue memorial was installed in Sale, Gippsland to record the 2013 National Apology and the 2012 Victorian State Apology to people affected by forced adoption or removal policies and practices.
January 2017	Lauren Howe (Auspiced by Lyrebird Community Centre): Understanding Adoption Peer Support Group Monthly peer support and information group for adult adoptees were held to increase support options for adult adoptees in the south-eastern suburbs of Melbourne.
June 2016	Anglicare A project to digitise over 2000 catalogued photographs of babies, children and children's homes; to improve storage, protection and access to archival material.
